2. Of general interest to our members and some specific interest to one of my readers in particular, Brooksfilm has started production on their next film. Brooksfilm is a production company owned by Mel Brooks, but often doing more serious films than Brooks is usually known for. You may remember they did ELEPHANT MAN. This film will be called THE DOCTOR AND THE DEVILS and will be an adaptation of a 30-year-old script by Dylan Thomas. Francis will direct. Francis did the camera work on films like THE INNOCENTS, FRENCH LIEUTENANT'S WOMAN, and ELEPHANT MAN, as well as directing films like THE EVIL OF FRANKENSTEIN, THE SKULL, and DRACULA HAS RISEN FROM THE GRAVE. The story appears from all accounts to be about Burke and Hare. These were two gentlemen in Edinburgh, Scotland who went into the biological supply business selling cadavers to one Dr. Knox of the local medical school. They started by supplying the bodies of hanged men, but when the demand outstripped the supply they turned to robbing graves to fill the gap. Unfortunately, even that was not enough supply to fill the demand and the results were not fresh enough. They then hit upon the idea of producing fresh, new cadavers. Robert Louis Stevenson made some reference to them in THE BODY SNATCHER and they were the subject of several films, novels, and accounts of macabre British history.
